I would like to encourage all residents of River Park help us plan River Park's Future. Christopher D Dressel, AICP, Senior Planner, Department of Community Investment stated:

"In partnership with neighborhood residents, businesses, institutions, and other stakeholders, the City of South Bend is creating a River Park Neighborhood Plan. The plan will be a guide for making decisions about what kind of is appropriate, how resources should be allocated, and how issues residents, business and property owners are concerned about should be addressed and a statement of what a neighborhood wants to achieve, and it provides a strategy to reach those goals.

- Neighborhood residents and businesses will use the plan to gain an understanding of planning initiatives in the short, medium, and long terms.
- Public officials and community leaders will use the plan to direct funding and to make decisions on zoning and land use issues.
- Planners and City staff will use the plan to understand key issues important to the area and as a guide to implementing priority projects and initiatives.

The process will be fully underway this Summer. We look forward to hearing your thoughts and working together to create the River Park Neighborhood Plan."

This plan is more than stop signs and street signs. This plan is the foundation for long term initiatives that will be the foundation for the next generation. No idea is too small or not important. Housing, education, recreation, businesses, programs, crime, neighborhood watch teams, entertainment, attracting new money, tourism, etc.
