Keep River Park in S.H.A.P.E.

It is basic. Mankind wants to have shelter, food, clothing, and an income. A person's home is his or her family's 'castle'. The *River Park Neighborhood Association's* standing committee's efforts, **Safety, Housing, and Asset Preservation** (SHAPE), try to address primarily the issues of finding, keeping, and improving our living conditions, and have been doing so since 2009. In this article, we will look at current governmental resources from the Housing Authority and the city's Community Investment.

The **Housing Authority** has two basic services: **Section 8** and **Public Housing**. <u>Section 8</u> serves families to pay for rent in a landlord's rental property. Public housing is found in units owned by the *Housing Authority*.

Typically, both have long waiting lists. It is possible for a person/family to be on both wait lists when the application period opens up. If a person has a larger family, is homeless, etc. they are issued more points. The more points you have, the sooner you reach the top of the wait list. The Key for both services is to apply when one or the other is officially opened for applications. It is currently estimated that within 40 days (as of mid-October 2025) for 2,3,4, & 5 bedroom needs. A two-bedroom requires, for example, a parent & child, etc.

South Bend's **Community Development** flagship is *Rebuilding Together (formerly Christmas in April)*. This program, now administered as of 2024 by the *Heritage Foundation*, selects a neighborhood and about twenty homes to upgrade with the help of volunteers and free services from various contractors. River Park was served by this program in 2010 and 2012. However, River Park was also served by other programs such as: the *Neighborhood Improved/Investment Program* for four years, *Refresh, Love Your Block*, as well as 27 homes that the RPNA did ourselves via our Housing Committee.

The city also offers the ongoing *Curb and Sidewalk* and *Lamppost* programs, where the city covers approximately half of the cost. Various utilities also offer utility assistance, like electric, gas, and water, based on income. Some of these can save a resident ranging from \$14 to \$25 per month.

Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority (IHCDA) also offers assistance. However, the city's past Rent-to-Own and First Time Home Buyers are currently in potential redevelopment.

Nevertheless, the city's **Community Investment's Neighborhood Division** serves as a managing conduit for the *Community Homebuyers Corporation* (CHC) that offers classes to help purchase homes with a 20% grant and \$1,000 toward closing costs. And their *Home Repair Program* will likely begin accepting applications this winter. The RPNA's SHAPE will keep you informed.





Safety, Housing, and Asset Preservation Efforts

The River Park Neighborhood Association is looking for interested people who would like to improve River Park. The **Safety, Housing, and Asset Preservation Efforts Committee** has been in existence since before 2009 as one of the standing committees of the *River Park Neighborhood Association*, in response to the *City of South Bend's* request for increased resident involvement in the development, safety, and preservation of its neighborhoods and services.

Our mission goals are:

- # 1 Work with neighbors whose houses are most in need and link with various improvement programs.
- # 2 Optimize the experiences of renters and landlords.
- # 3 Facilitate improvements in other commercial and non-commercial properties.
- # 4 Work to improve infrastructure conditions, including sidewalks and alleys.
- # 5Partner with city departments such as: Community Investment, Code Enforcement, South Bend Police Department, and other neighborhood partners, as well as with other agencies, institutions, including IUSB, service groups, charitable organizations, businesses, and other concerned individuals.
- # 6 Keep River Park residents informed on how they can keep their homes and improve their neighborhoods, and empower them to be more proactive in River Park's success. It is also envisioned to develop rental and home-buying resources.
- # 7 Coordinate the presentation of River Park's history and its historic preservation.
- # 8 Improve the safety of River Park in the mission-memory of the *Neighborhood Crime Watch* model.

Over the past 15 years, we have helped improve over 50 homes, coordinated many area-wide clean-up campaigns, contributed to the safety of River Park by 400% from our inception, and have offered many safety and history seminars.
