
The Well Coffee House opens on the Ave


has purchased ceramicstyle travel mugs, and will be selling them from the coffee house for \$5. All the

icons differentiating thefts, thefts from vehicles, breaking and entering, assaults, sex offenders, as well as the option to add and remove icons on the map. Then take a step outside your door and confirm that your house numbers are easily visible from the street during evening hours, that our porch is well lit and that you can see the lit porches of your neighbors. These three tasks can have a great impact on the ability of the police to send squad cars to the proper addresses and/or see crimes in progress.
