For more detailed information about recent crimes in River Park, you can check out the crime map provided by SpotCrime.





The Well

Board games, comfortable sofas and relaxing chairs, coffee and sodas; all creating an enjoyable atmosphere and all attributes of The Well. Located in River Park Square, The Well is a non-profit cafe open to the community and is run solely by volunteers. I recently made a visit there to explore what it's all about. Not only does it offer great coffee, it offers an array of board games and casual seating with an art deco appearance. The art on the wall was from local artists and was for sale. I spoke with the longest committed volunteer at the shop, and when I asked him to describe The Well he said their original motto puts it best; "The Well is meant to be Mishawaka Avenue's living room".

I chose my seat then ordered my usual, a latte. I was amazed by both the friendliness of the volunteers, and the presentation and flavor of my coffee. As the volunteer made my coffee, we discussed what The Well was all about. I learned that besides being a coffee shop, The Well has been established to be a fun place for hosting a variety of activities. The Well is a unique space, made up of the main cafe and then three different rooms within the building: a conference room where different organizations hold meetings, a basement, and an upstairs. The different areas allow spaces for a variety of events in which everyone can participate. Dance class was taking place upstairs while the basement was a space for open mic night and game nights. The purpose for The Well is for members of our community to have a space to interact, relax and enjoy friends.









The Well offers a great website for people to easily access a calendar of events. Community members can enjoy many activities at The Well. For example, Tuesday's Book Club Night, Wednesday's are Board Game Nights and Dynamite at the Coffee, and every Thursday they have a Super-Smash Bros Game and Craft night. They also host a variety of other events such as Michiana songwriters, A Cuppa Crafters Farmers Market, and at the end of every month there's a Waffle Night, so don't forget to mark your calendar for Waffles on November 30th!

Being a non profit organization takes a lot of good people working together in order to stay open. Volunteers are essential to keep The Well going and those working will share in the challenges the organization faces. Upon entering patrons can see posted bills that must be paid and visitors can make a donation if they wish. They also have a QR code for patrons to contribute as well which makes it very quick and easy to make a donation.

After visiting The Well with my friends we all agreed that "Mishawaka Avenue's Living Room" is a fitting, relaxing and comfortable place where everyone can hang out. My friends, who are very picky, truly enjoyed the atmosphere. For one of them, it was simple snacks, regular sodas such as Coke and Mountain Dew, or Italian sodas. The other said the atmosphere felt like being at home, even without knowing about the volunteers' conversation. I agree. It was one of the most enjoyable places I had been to in a while. I took the time to play a board game, look at the art, and talk to the friendly workers. The Well provided more than just coffee. It is a place to socialize and engage in activities many of us don't make time for.



Busy Hands Of Michiana

Busy Hands of Michiana is an all-volunteer, non-profit organization serving over 100 agencies in nine counties of Northern Indiana and Southwest Michigan. We sew, knit and crochet 80 products that we distribute free of charge. We provide products for therapy, warmth and comfort to agencies and therapists serving autistic children, nursing homes, homeless shelters, community centers, cancer treatment centers, hospice, schools and other agencies serving people of all ages who are dealing with a variety of life challenging situations.

Some of the items we gave to agencies to distribute to their clients last year included:

• 1,815 hand-made hats, scarves and mittens for children and adults

• 406 crocheted lap blankets and shawls to nursing homes

• 180 weighted blankets and vests and 255 weighted stuffed animals to autistic children

In total, Busy Hands made and gave out 10,911 items last year. Our 50 volunteers logged 20,329 hours working for Busy Hands. Our supplies of fabric and yarn are predominately from donations. 90% of what we make is from donated fabric and yarn. We make useful, needed items from materials that might otherwise go to the landfill.

Busy Hands is located in the lower level of River Park United Methodist Church. RPUMC generously offered us space for our operation when we had to move from our previous location. We have been happily working in River Park for nearly 4 years. We are open Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 9:00 -12:00. We invite visitors to stop by and see what we do in person. We welcome new volunteers who sew, knit or crochet. We welcome donations of fabric, notions, yarn and stuffed animals.
