Thank you to all the River Park neighbors who attended either the River Park Neighborhood Plan meeting or the Potawatomi Park Plan at the River Park Library on April 29th and 30th. We appreciate your input!

I met with Chris Dressel, South Bend Senior Planner, and we discussed the comments circulating around Kids Kingdom. Chris told me the structure will not be taken down right away. It will stay up until the new playground is built and elements of Kids Kingdom will be integrated into the new playground.

As a neighborhood association we need to talk about the plans and how we want to react to them. We will present a response to the Planning Commission and the South Bend Council when they meet later in the year. This is a change from the meetings we had expected in early summer. Until then, we will continue to discuss the city's plans at our monthly meetings. We have time to develop a consensus about how to respond.

Ricardo Nevarez is the small business owner of Dito's Investments and Construction on Mishawaka Ave. This business is owned and operated by Ricardo and his family with the goal of providing equal housing opportunities to families in the River Park community.

Dito's Investments and Construction buys apartments and homes to fix and rent to low income households in order to provide them with housing options they can afford. The company works closely with section 8 families.

By fixing the homes and renting them, they not only provide housing for families, but also bring more value to River Park. Each time they fix a home and make it more presentable, the community looks better and this increases the value of the neighborhood around it.

Ricardo expressed his joy in repairing homes and being able to provide low income families with a place to live. He shared with me that he has not dealt with many homes in River Park this year, but he looks forward to meeting new people and helping more people love their homes.

Overall Ricardo cares about making people feel at home and comfortable no matter what their background or financial situation. Being comfortable in your living space is important.

# South Bend Police Department -- Camera Registry Program Help Keep River Park Safe! by Pam Claeys

Brianne Fenton, Senior Crime Analyst with SBPD Strategic Intel Office, attended the River Park Neighborhood Association's April 11th meeting to present information about the "Sync South Bend Camera Registry Program." This program has 2 components: one for homeowners/renters and one for businesses. Both programs will expedite police investigations by sharing your security cameras with SBPD!

## Homeowners/Renters

There are currently 1364 residential cameras registered in the program in South Bend. All one needs to do is go online to <a href="www.syncsouthbend.org">www.syncsouthbend.org</a> and register your home security camera/s. The only information needed from a homeowner or renter is the home's address and then their contact information. IF a crime occurs near the area of your registered camera, an SBPD officer or detective may contact you. They would ask you to share any video footage for that particular time frame in order to help solve the crime.

\*\*\*SBPD cannot directly access any residential cameras registered.

\*\*\*This program is totally FREE and VOLUNTARY for the homeowner or renter.

## **Businesses**

There are currently 795 cameras integrated in the City's Camera Integration Program that encompasses local businesses. A business would first need go online to <a href="https://www.syncsouthbend.org">www.syncsouthbend.org</a> in order to purchase a "FUSUS core device" that would allow a business to integrate their camera/s into the SBPD's Real Time Crime Center. FYI, Ring cameras do NOT work with the integrated business camera.

Last year, a Business Security grant assisted 50+ businesses by providing the FUSUS core, camera, lighting, and assistance with set-up. A second round of assistance for businesses will open in May 2024 and will include all of the above. Additionally, these grants will also be open to non-profit organizations and churches.

\*\*\*Camera feed can be accessed by SBPD in the event of an emergency or crime in progress.

\*\*\*Cameras provide enhanced situational awareness when responding to your business.

Rio Park Events on 3028 Mishawaka Avenue is a great place to book your next event. After moving all over for work, Sarah Overholser wanted to come back to her roots to settle down and start a business. Overholser opened Rio Park Events in October 2019. The sky is the limit when it comes to what you can book with Rio Park Events. From fashion shows to trivia nights and even barber competitions, Overholser says, "Every event is impactful to us and goes a long way. We are grateful to still be here and for our employees."

What makes Rio Park Events special is how unique it is. There are two different rooms available to rent out; a Small Hall that seats 50-60 people and a Large Hall that seats 100-150 people. The Small Hall is more typically used for birthday parties and baby showers, while the Large Hall has seen weddings and quinceaneras. If you are looking for something with two rooms, you are able to rent both the Small and Large Hall for your event. Rio Park Events also offers a Table and Linen package where you can rent their supplies for your event off-site! Along with tables and linens, there are other décor that is able to be rented for your event.

Overholser's future plans for her business include trying to beautify the exterior of the business so more customers are drawn to it. She also wants to focus more on off-site rentals and try and find a way to cater to different events more efficiently.

# Your Potawatomi Zoo By Alison Smythe, IUSB Honors Program

The Potawatomi Zoo has been open in our community since 1921. It started off small with a few deer. It has grown greatly over the past 100 years. In these past few years the zoo has focused on modernizing the campus for visitors. From building new facilities for the animals to bringing giraffes to the zoo, the staff's main goal over these past years has been to improve the zoo for the community.

One of the important details about the Potawatomi Zoo is that it is accredited. This means that the Potawatomi Zoo follows higher standards for animal welfare, health, living conditions, as well as many other criteria. These zoos have to be re-certified every 5 years by the AZA (The Association of Zoos and Aquariums). Potawatomi Zoo has been an accredited zoo since 1987. Through the AZA the Potawatomi Zoo is also part of the Species Survival Plan (SSP). This program helps Potawatomi Zoo safely breed animals based on genetics.

The growth over the past few years has greatly helped the zoo. It has made some major upgrades to modernize it for the community. The biggest additions are the giraffes in 2022. The popular giraffes have helped the zoo park set a new attendance record. People love them. The zoo has gone from 211,000 visitors in 2019 to 351,000 this past year. A new structure this year is The Lodge. The Lodge is a concession and dining establishment attached to an Andean Bear Habitat!

As well as the new additions, the zoo is excited for the events they have coming up. These events include the Eat and Drink at the Zoo (21+) June 8th from 5-8pm, as well as 28 corporate events that they already have scheduled. They also plan to host the annual Zoo Brew on the 21st of September.

The Potawatomi Zoo is definitely proud of the growth of attendance and the building of better habitats for the animals. The Potawatomi Zoo is excited for the future. www.potawatomizoo.org




