




Later the company expanded and moved across the street to its current location. John Bognar Jr. and wife Wendy are now retiring. Their presence on The Avenue will be missed.

and tech incubators, Make South Bend offers a wide variety of tools and resources for those interested in making things be they crafters, artists, woodworkers or entrepreneurs. With over \$15,000 worth of tools such as a 3D printer, laser cutter, pottery wheels, kilns, woodworking tools, print making equipment and others too numerous to mention, Make South Bend hopes to provide support to local artists and makers and to provide the community at large access to art and the maker movement. Artists can collaborate with others to incorporate new ideas and mediums into their work and receive the support they need to grow in their gifts.

On going classes in such things as diverse as electrical soldering, 3D design, oil painting, crocheting and jewelry making, to mention just a few, make it easy to try a new art form without committing the time and money needed for traditional art classes or to try it on their own. We both have the same desire to provide help to those who need it. I am currently in graduate school studying for the ministry while Cleo runs the store during the week. We are associated with Albright United Methodist Church but we are an independent organization and receive no support from them or any other organization. This ministry was started to help provide clothing and small household items to those who are in need. Clients may come in once a month and pick out two outfits per family member. The first time they come in they can

also pick out a pair of shoes if needed. They may also receive a few other necessities if they are available such as a towel, sheets and blanket. We also help with dishes, a coffee pot, toaster and other small essentials if available. We are a registered 501 (C) (3) and are run completely by volunteers. No one receives any payment for his or her work. My sister Cleo and I are the volunteers in charge and neither of us receives any monetary benefit from the ministry. We have a clothes closet and a thrift shop. Everything is priced and available for sale. Whatever money is received by selling items is used to help pay expenses such as electric, heat, insurance and other expenses that we incur. We do not currently take in enough to pay much more than the electric at this time but as word gets out we hope to do more and become self-supporting. If you are in need of a bit of help with

clothing or small household items please come and see us or call Cleo at (574) 232-8025 Hours: Tue Wed Fri Sat 10-5 We accept donations of clean gently used items that we sell to help support the ministry but

we also make a majority of those items free to those who are in need of them. We give away much more than we sell but sales are needed to keep the doors open. We also plan on putting tables out in the front parking lot with reading and activity books that will be available to use there or to take home. We will have a book exchange so that you can take a book, read it, and trade in for another one. We are not sure when this will begin, we need to make sure that it is

City announces curb and sidewalk repair reimbursement program



The City of South Bend is implementing a new curb and sidewalk repair reimbursement program to assist property owners in making needed repairs to curbs and sidewalks abutting their properties. This reimbursement program replaces a former program requiring residents to pay for half the costs of repair. It is hoped that this program will help improve safety, access and aesthetics for residents in neighborhoods through out the city. Residents will have more control over the repair process and time frame with the intention of making the system more efficient.

Residents will be reimbursed at the rate of \$20.00 per linear foot for sidewalks and \$15.00 per linear foot for curbs. Private, bonded contractors selected by the property owner must perform the work. Additional information may be obtained by calling the City's resident service line at

Tattoo parlor seeking zoning exception on The Avenue

A rezoning petition has been submitted for property located within River Park. The Area Plan Commission will hold a public hearing in the Council Chambers, located on the 4th floor of the County-City Building, on Tuesday, May 19, 2015 at 3:30P.M., at which time the following will be considered:

A combined public hearing on a proposed ordinance of New Paris Development Co. LLC to zone from MU Mixed Use District to LB Local Business District; seeking a special use exception to allow for a tattoo, body piercing establishment; and seeking the following two variances: 1. from the required 12 parking spaces to 0; and 2. from the required 500'

separation from a religious use to 20', property located at 2212 Mishawaka Avenue, City of South Bend - APC# 2742-15.

You are invited to express your opinion on behalf of the neighborhood regarding this petition at the public hearing or submit written comments to the Commission prior to the hearing. Written comments received by the commission will become part of the petition file but will not be read at the public hearing. A Commission Staff Report and Preliminary Staff Recommendation will be available on the Commission's website, www.stjosephcountyindiana .com/departments/Areaplan, and at the Commission Office after 1:00 PM on Monday, May 11, 2015.

The Common Council will hold a separate public hearing on this petition at a later date at which they will make a final decision to either rezone or not rezone the subject property. There will not be a notice for that hearing, it is suggested that you contact the Council Office for time and place of their hearing.

Housing and Asset Preservation Committee seeking members and chairperson

The Housing and Asset Preservation Committee has d great recent history by improving 27 homes in River Park, along with area wide cleanups and seminars, like December 2013's First Time Home Buyers program. This program can provide up to \$20,000 off a \$100,000 mortgage for someone who has not had his or her own home for three years. This is decided with a sliding scale, which means that most people in River Park are eligible for super savings now and in the long term.

Along with First Source
Bank, the River Park
Neighborhood Association's
Housing and Asset
Preservation Committee has
bmoted the Neighborhood

Impact Program (NIP) for four years now. NIP helps to improve owner occupied homes with their roof, furnace, windows, etc. River Park has been the most successful in obtaining tens of thousands of dollars each year.

The Housing and Asset
Preservation Committee was
formed in February 2009 as
one of the five sub
committees of the River Park
Neighborhood Association in
response to the City South
Bend's request to have more
resident involvement in the
development and preservation
of its neighborhoods and
services, especially in light of
decreased revenues due to
lower property tax rates.

Yard waste ordinance now in effect

Residents are no longer allowed to use plastic bags to dispose of their yard waste. Yard waste for pickup must now be placed in biodegradable paper bags or other containers approved by the City and separated from other refuse. Individual bags or containers must not weigh

more than 35 pounds when full. Residents may rent a yard waste container from the city during the yard waste collection period from April through November. Cost for this 96 gallon container labeled "Yard Waste Only" is \$16.00 for the season. This container is not subject to the 35-pound weight limit. Call the City at 311 to obtain a container.

Our mission goals are:

Great progress has been made

Between 2009 -2012
Housing's volunteers have improved 27 properties.
There have been three clean ups of 1.5 miles of railroad track along our northern boundary and two area wide clean up projects coordinated. Over a dozen residents have been invigorated about what they

can do. The Committee has also provided three history presentations, River Park's History Month, and the Centennial feature in the South Bend Tribune.


NIP Home Improvement Residents encouraged to become a Grants available

Nip is back again this year. River Park led the city in the amount of neighborhood home improvement grants totaling almost \$30,000. Just about every River Park homeowner is eligible to get needed home repairs, such as new furnace, new roof, replacement windows, etc. just about anything that needs repaired or replaced in your home. The grants come from the required 10% of federal mortgage loans' profits For Indiana they come from the Federal Home Loan Bank of Indianapolis and channeled via our own First Source Bank.

There are three grants: 1.up to \$7,500 for those who have or will get an account.

2.up to \$10,000 for those who have a mortgage or refinance an existing mortgage. In most cases



your overall interest payments are also reduced.

3.up to \$10,000 AMP (Accessible Modified Program for those over 62 or who have a disability program (such as SSI or SSD) to get ramps, wider doors, accessible shower or tub, handrails, chair lifts, etc.

Contact Adam Gill in River Park's First Source Bank @ 235-2320 and look at the enclosed flier. In addition to these savings, you will also improved the value of your home, have better heating/cooling savings, and improve your living conditions.

Don't wait. It is a first come, first serve program for all of Indiana with \$300,000 earmarked by FHLB for NE Indiana.

These opportunities are recommend by RPNA's Housing and Asset Preservation Committee. It is in its fourth year in River Park.

Neighborhood Crime Watch Captain

Be part of South Bend's NCW Network and make River Park even safer by Phil Niswonger

River Park is safer because it has, in my opinion, the best Neighborhood Crime Watch system of captains in South Bend, called the Network, and every citizen is encouraged to consider becoming a captain. River Park NCW Network is currently composed of 121 captains. The Network is divided into six sections and subdivided into clusters of captains wherever possible. The Network gives two extra layers of service by its link with the city of South Bend Police Dept. and the RPNA Safety Committee. Our captains feel more confident as they can relate to other captains. They are also encouraged to participate in the monthly captains meetings at the SBPD and with the Safety Committee. Most captains have about

five to ten neighbors that they link with. The only thing needed to be a captain is a local phone number and, helpfully, an answering machine. You need not to be a homeowner, renters are encouraged to participate as well. The only requirements are to keep an eye out for your neighbor, call in suspicious activity, like any good citizen, and to relay the occasional message from the SBPD to your neighbors.

Homeownership Assistance Program

Community Homebuyers
Corporation (CHC), a notr-profit organization,
created the Homeownership
Assistance Program to help
individuals become first-time
homebuyers.

The Homeownership
Assistance Program is the result of six local financial institutions joining with the city of South Bend to help people get a good home at an affordable price. For those who qualify and meet some simple, ongoing criteria, grant money is available as a forgivable loan equal to 20% of the purchase price based on household income.
All properties purchased through the Homeownership

Assistance Program must be owner-occupied, single-family units within the city limits of South Bend.
Condominiums are also eligible.

The property sale price may not exceed \$95,000. (The property must appraise for at least the sale price.) All properties purchased through the program must be brought to a condition that will reduce the risk for additional repairs and costly maintenance. All clients are urged to obtain property inspections, which are independent of the Community Homebuyers Corporation inspection. This program provides

assistance to first-time homeowners through a grant with federal funds provided to CHC by the city of South Bend for those that qualify. As with any grant there are criteria which must be met for the grant to be paid in full. Some of the requirements are up front and some are post-purchase. Following the completion of all pre- and post-purchase requirements,

participants will visit with the city of South Bend Housing Counselor for a review and to receive their completion certificate.

Since 1992 the Community Homebuyers Corporation has helped more than 500 families purchase a new home. Visit www.AHomeAllMyOwn.org for further information.

Welcoming Spring in River Park



poor and also very stingy. Three hungry travelers came to visit this little town and found that no one was willing to share any of

their food. So the travelers

played a trick and made a pot of stone soup with water and three pebbles. Before long the


