HAVE YOU BEEN PURGED FROM THE INDIANA VOTER ROLLS?

DID YOU KNOW THAT NEARLY 500,000 HOOSIERS WERE REMOVED FROM THE VOTER REGISTRATION ROLLS IN 2017 BY THE INDIANA SECRETARY OF STATE? IN ST. JOSEPH COUNTY, 28,000 VOTERS WERE PURGED. IN OUR CITY COUNCIL DISTRICT 3 ALONE, 1,915 VOTERS WERE PURGED.

This voter purge targeted those who had not responded to postcards and had not voted in the last two general elections.

WHAT ABOUT YOU?

Please be sure you are registered to vote! Your vote is very important! Our next election is the Primary Election on May 8th and your vote is your voice.

The deadline to register to vote for the May 8th primary is Monday, April 9, 2018. Make sure you are registered to vote. You don't want to go to your polling place on election day to find out your name is not on the rolls. It is better to check your voter registration status NOW than to risk your name having been removed without your knowledge and being unable to cast a vote.

You can easily check your voter registration status by going to the following website: www.lndianavoters.com.

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

Please share this 'voter purge' information with as many Indiana folks as possible and help them check their voter registration status. Load the app on your phone and you can help someone at any time.

<u>Via Smartphone</u>: Download the Indiana Voters app to your phone and help make sure all your family and friends are registered to vote and have not been purged.

Via Computer: Bookmark this website to your computer and ensure your family and friends are registered, as above.

NOT REGISTERED OR KNOW SOMEONE NOT REGISTERED?

You can register or help someone online at <u>indianavoters.com</u>. You can also register to vote in person at the St. Joseph County Voter Registration Office, 4th Floor, County City Building. Their phone is 574-235-9521; hours are 8am to 4:30pm, Monday through Friday. Please call them if you have any questions!

In addition to registering to vote online, you can <u>confirm and update your voter registration</u> information, print an "Application for Absentee Ballot Request," find your polling place, see who your elected officials are, review candidates on your ballot, find out how to be a paid poll worker, and much more.

I can help you register to vote. I will be at the next RPNA meeting, March 8th, and can assist you before or after the meeting. It is a short form to complete and will only take a minute. Be sure to bring your driver's license number or the last 4 digits of your Social Security Number. Please contact me at 574-288-5951 if you need a special time to register.


and afterwards have an Irish Meal and free Celtic Music at the St. Patrick Center Noon to 4 PM.
